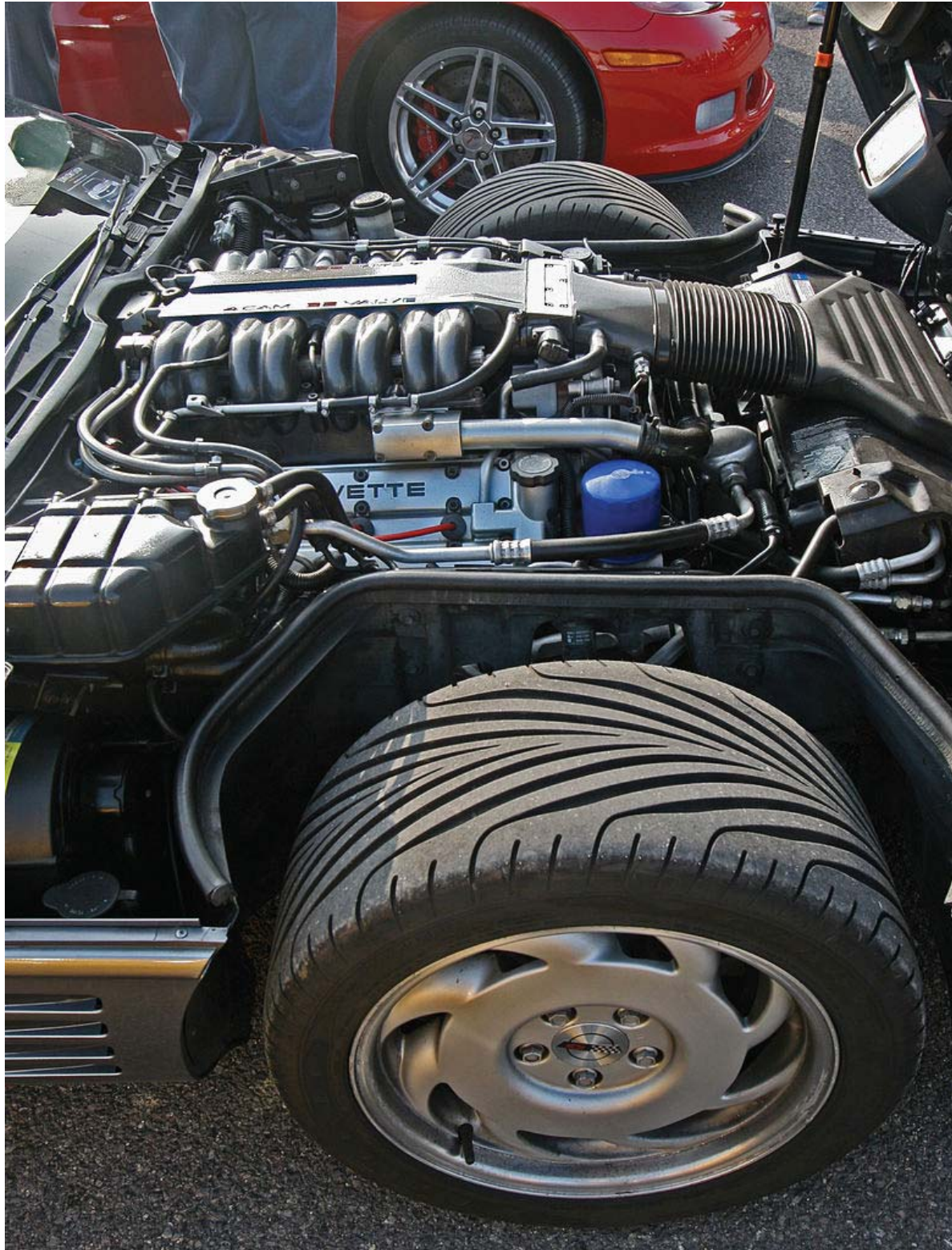

Mitch Factor brought the meeting to order at 7:30 PM, June 15, 2012, and thanked everyone for all the well wishes, phone calls, and cards he received after his open-heart surgery.

The May minutes were approved as printed in the June newsletter. The treasurer, Jim Iuele, gave the treasurer's report and said we had three outstanding checks that had not been cashed.

The NCCC Governor, Paul Wolter, reported:

He attended the NCCC meeting and 38 officers were reinstated. Sanctioned events for this year total 1,002. Also, NCCC has 16,000 members. Molinda reached the end of her term for serving as NCCC treasurer and Paul was elected to replace her. NCCC dues have been raised to \$45 per person for new members but renewals will remain at \$35. NCCC insurance includes trailer and equipment. Also, NCCC convention is next week. Next year the NCCC convention will be at Bowling Green and our club might want to go to that one. Three NCCC officer positions will be open if someone wants to participate in the national arena.

Membership Chairperson, Mary Wolter, said we did not have any visitors tonight but Tom and Letty Grabos were present. Tom thanked everyone for all their visits, cards, phone calls and help he received from members of CCT while he was recovering from his heart transplant.

Activities:

Paul reported that the July 4th parade would be the same as we have done for the last few years. Meet at his house at 8:30 AM and everyone could caravan to the start of the parade. Bring candy for the kids, milk bones for the dogs and the club has some beads to hand out to each CCT car participating. We will go to a new place for lunch that Mary has scouted out for this year.

Paul discussed the trip taken to Oklahoma this month. We had good participation.

Saturday, June 30 will be a 50th Anniversary of the Shelby Tour.

Keith Amendson gave away some posters from Corvette Expo Dallas in 1987 and some other memorabilia. He also said he drove up to the casino just across the border to Oklahoma a couple of weeks ago and walked away with \$5,800. This helped him to attend another 50h club anniversary in Iowa.

David Cooper proposed we have our July club meeting at the Texas Steak House in Richardson at Jupiter and Bush toll road, east of Hwy. 75.

Paul Wolter said he wanted to give up the responsibility of heading up the one and only autocross we have every year with Cowtown. He would like for someone else to head up the autocross if the CCT still wants to put on the event. He will help the new person with all the needed details of putting on the event.

Gene Whitaker conducted the raffle and Charles took pictures of the winners for the newsletter. Charles said we took in \$37 for the raffle. Everyone was invited to attend the after-club dinner at Toby Keith's Restaurant and Lounge on Northwest Highway on the same street where Olive Garden is located. This was arranged by Ken and Jeanette Bradley.

The meeting adjourned at 8:30 PM.

Direction #3

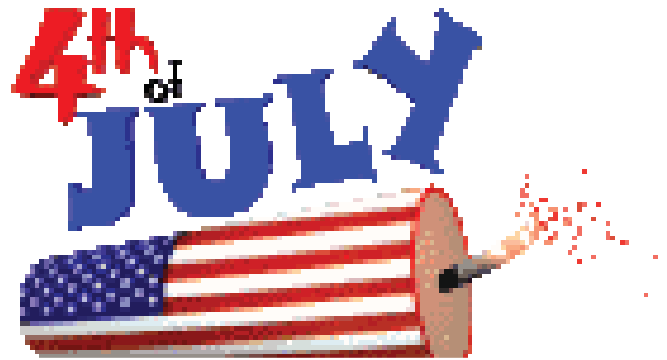
75 north, exit Renner Road, go east to second light (Wyndham) turn left, TEXAS will be on right

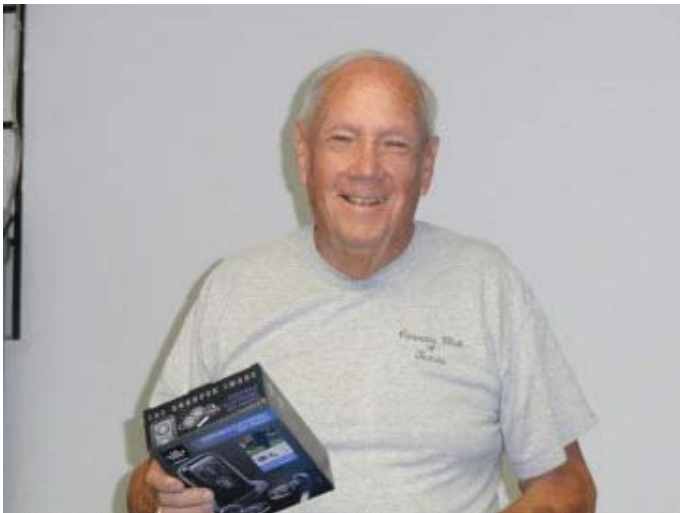

June 5, 2012 Transit of Venus

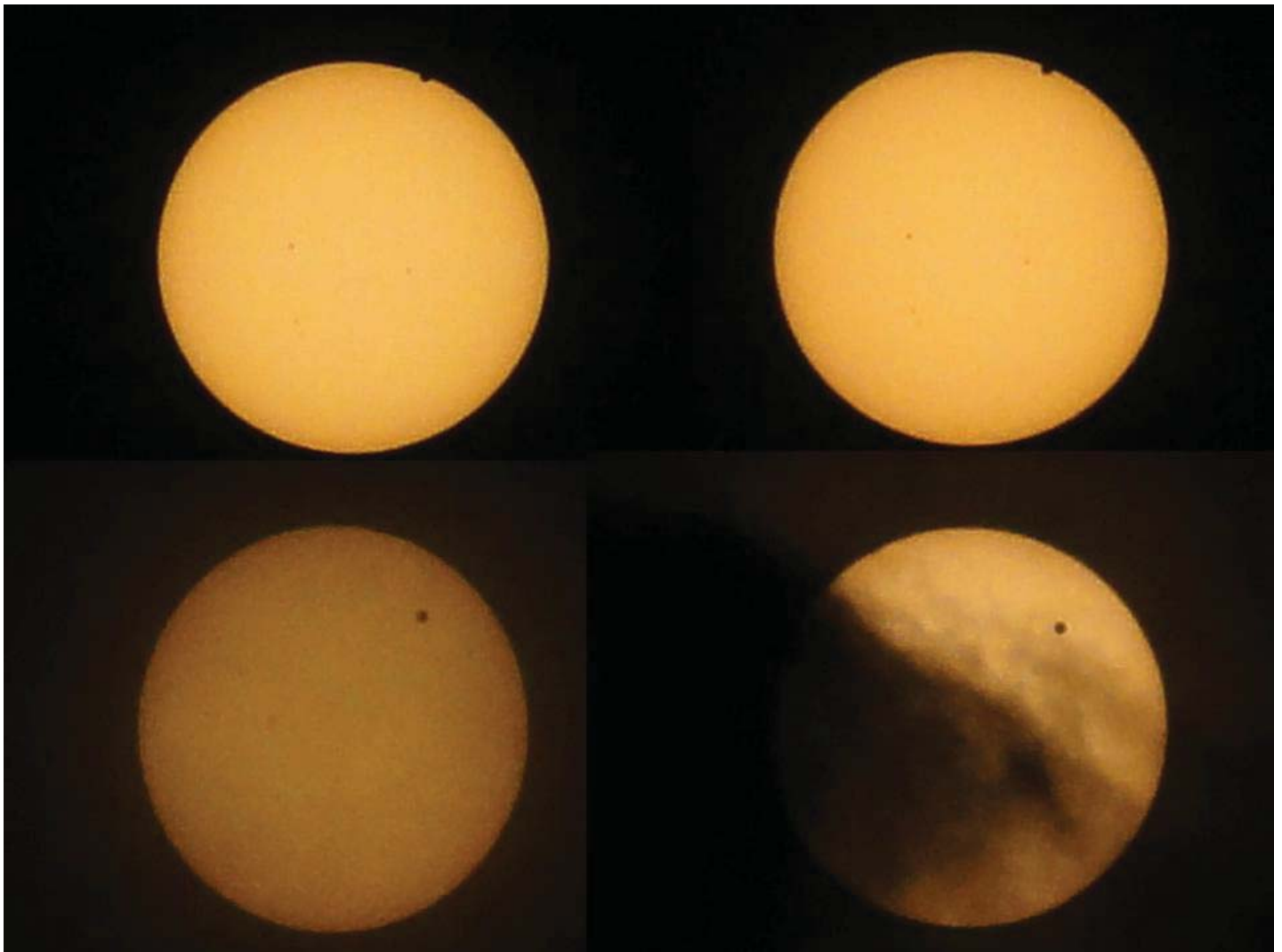
The June 5th 2012 Transit of Venus across the Sun was photographed using my Sony DSC-HX5V camera mounted on a tripod. This is the same camera that I use at the club meetings to take photographs for our newsletter. A solar filter made by Thousand Oaks Optical was held on the camera by an adapter that I machined from PVC. The start of the transit is called "First Contact" and that occurred at 5:05:08 p.m. CDT. The first photograph (upper left) was taken at 5:13:58 about 9 minutes after first contact with an exposure of 1/1600 second, 10X optical zoom and image stabilization.

The second photograph (upper right) was at 5:16:38 about 11 minutes after first contact with the same parameters. The transit of Venus has not proceeded to "Second Contact" where Venus would appear to be 100% on the Sun.

As always seems to happen in astronomy, the clouds came and there was a little drizzle that covered a period of an hour and 20 minutes. The third photograph (lower left) was a 6:45:53 through a cloud layer when Venus was well into its transit. None of these photographs have been altered in any way such as changing the contrast or color, but they have been enlarged so that Venus is visible. The color that you see around the Sun is due to the cloud layer. The exposure of this photograph was increased to 1/400 second, but nothing else changed.

The fourth photograph (lower right) was taken at 6:59:25 as the clouds started to close in and prevented seeing the transit any further. The photograph has some character to it that reminds me of a photograph of the Moon at Halloween time. The exposure time was increased again to 1/200 second and the clouds dominate it.

Transits of Venus are in 8-year pairs and we won't be around in 105 or 113 years to see the next pair in 2117 and 2125.



Governors Report By Paul Wolter

It doesn't seem possible that we are already half way thru 2012. Now that we are having 100 degree temperatures again in Texas, I know that we will experience the days going by a lot slower! Guess it's time to use the swimming pool more often. Since we typically have hot weather in July and August, there are no NCCC events scheduled to occur during those months. But there are other car related events that we can participate in. The next event is in just several days, which is the Westcliff West Neighborhood 4th of July parade in Southwest Ft. Worth. See the flyer in this newsletter for participation information.



The first local NCCC event will be the 16th Annual Super Speedway 14 Autocross event at the Texas Motor Speedway that is being hosted by Cowtown Vettes. Be sure and go out and participate or go watch and socialize with the participants and hosts. Cowtown will also be hosting a one day NCCC non-racing event using three of our CCT's unused NCCC sanctions on September 29th or 30th (Saturday or Sunday). These events will consist of a People's Choice Car Show, a Funkhana followed by a Gimmick and Chance (poker) Rallye which will be run simultaneously.

We are looking for a CCT member to volunteer to be the weekend coordinator for our next year's 2013 autocross event. I have been the weekend coordinator for the past 12 years and have decided that it's time to have another member take over. I will train, advise and help as necessary. If we can't find a replacement, then CCT will most

likely discontinue hosting the annual autocross events in conjunction with CTV. I believe that we should continue hosting the NCCC events for the racers and for the NCCC organization, but it's time for a new person to take over. This is the "only" event that we host which generates an income for the club (other than the annual membership dues, which will likely be required to increase next year to partially help offset the autocross income loss).

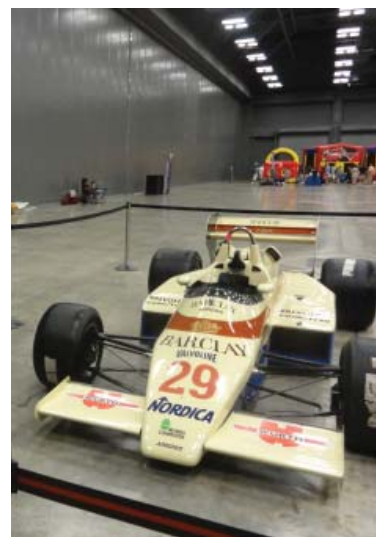

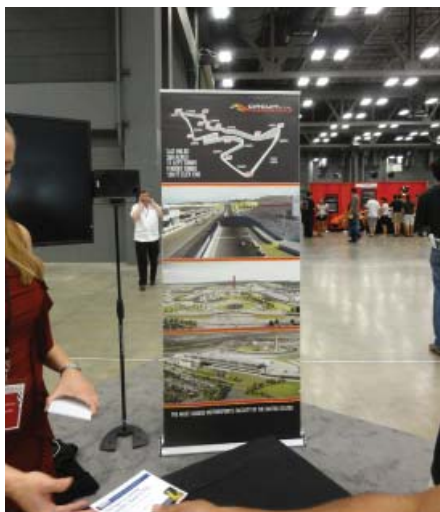
