Paulette and I just got back from a 2000+ miles trip to Chicago to visit with my mother on her 95th birthday. We had a great time with her and catching up with old friends in the Chicago area. We even had time to do the tourist bit, going to Millennium Park in Downtown Chicago and of course eating at many good restaurants in the area. It was, basically, a loong drive and eat.

And no, we didn't drive the C7. We took our Suburban because the Corvette was too confining, both on passenger space and cargo capacity. But, considering we weighed about 8000 lbs with the car, people and cargo, we did pretty well getting about 19.7 MPG overall.

Found out, when we got back, that we were really lucky. The last 1000 miles, or so was done with a 3 inch nail in a rear tire. Driving that far on it ruined the tire on the inside so it couldn't be fixed. But is was a very slow leak, so we made it home safely just using a compressor one time. Decided to put on a full set in an abundance of caution. Turns out four tires for the Suburban, including warranty and life time alignment, cost about same as the two front tires alone for my 2012 Corvette Grand Sport.

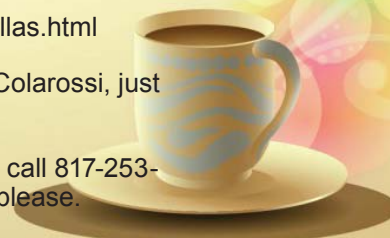

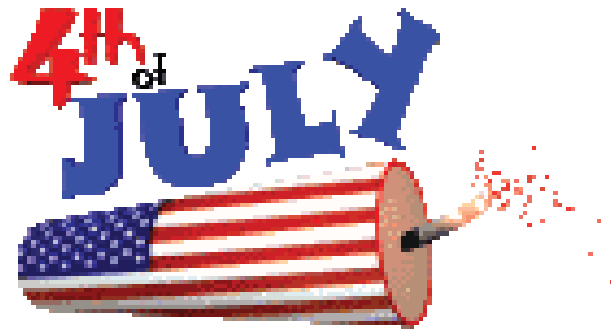

We attended CTV's 4th Annual Spring Scramble on June 13th at Fat Daddy's in Mansfield and showed our '64 Corvette. Our neighbors Bruce & Deb Allen showed their stock '62 Corvette and restomod '62 Corvette, which won the People's Choice Award. Their friends, Ron & Carol, owners of Contemporary Corvettes in Bristol, Pennsylvania, drove the stock '62 Corvette to the car show and liked it so much they convinced Bruce & Deb that they needed to add the '62 Vette to their collection; so the Corvette now resides in Bristol.

Saturday evening, June 13th I attended the SWR Governor's meeting at the Ft. Worth Hampton Inn near TMS. Here are some of the items which were discussed at the

Governor's meeting:

- NCCC is giving new Corvette purchasers who take NCM delivery 1 year free membership
- Proposals for hosting the 2015 SWR awards banquet will be accepted at the September Governor's meeting
- First Choice Weekend requests for 2016 will be accepted at the September Governor's meeting
- Nominations for the 2016 Regional Executive will be made at the September Governor's meeting
- Longhorn Corvette Club and the Oklahoma City Corvette Club each donated \$500 for the SWR Scholarship fund
- The Waco Corvette Club Centex hosted a SWR fundraiser and donated the \$875 profit to the SWR Treasury

On Sunday, June 14th we watched the local Outlaws Corvette Club host 7 autocrosses in the bus parking lot at the Texas Motor Speedway. There we visited with former CCT members Don & Valorie Hewett who drove their new 2015 C7 from Hot Springs, Arkansas to participate in the autocrosses. They had 23 racers that participated in the autocross.

There will be no autocross events conducted in the SWR in July and August because the hot weather we typically experience is pretty much unbearable for both the event workers and the participants. The next local NCCC sanctioned event will be CTV's yearly autocrosses September 19-20th at TMS. They are hosting 12 low speed autocrosses. That event usually has approximately 60 racers and draws competitors from out of state.

The 2015 NCCC convention will be held in Lake Harmony, PA in the Pocono Mountains August 22-27. On-line registration opens February 1st. Convention information and registration is provided at <http://www.Corvettesnccc.org/> This will be the last new Corvette that NCCC will raffle off, since after paying for the raffle car there are no residual funds left to donate to the National Kidney foundation. The NCM and other organizations have been conducting numerous Corvette raffles each year, which greatly reduced NCCC raffle ticket sales.
