The president, Mitch Factor, brought the meeting to order at 7:30 PM, January 21, 2005. Mitch announced the after-meeting event would be at the Texas Land and Cattle on Northwest Highway and everyone was welcome and should sign the sheet if they wanted to go. There would be a few questions to answer and a charge of \$2.00 per car with a prize for the winner.

The secretary read the January board minutes taken by JoAnn Powdrill, and they were approved as read. The Christmas party served as the membership meeting for December and no official minutes were taken. The treasurer, Mel Roggenbuck, gave the treasurer's report. JoAnn showed everyone the beautiful glass trophy that was presented to the Club for participating in the Speedway Children's Charities and she will add it to the CCT trophy case at Friendly.

Mitch commented on upcoming events and asked for a volunteer for Activities Chairman. Dennis Bertwell and Ben Loflin volunteered to co-chair activities. Mitch also said we need a couple to volunteer to take care of the Club's trophy case at Friendly for each quarter. It is an easy job and all you have to do is come about 30 minutes before the meeting and dust the trophies. During that time you can display one of your Corvette memorabilia in the case. Ben Loflin, reported on the trip to Natchitoches last month to see the Christmas lights.

Ken Bradley announced that he was planning another trip to Angel Fire for July 4th and wanted to know how many people would be interested this year. Several couples raised their hands (Factor, Arbogast, Mischel, Powdrill, Loflin, Bertwell). Ken mentioned several activities that would take place over the 6-7 day period: Horseback riding in the mountains with a cowboy steak dinner and cowboy singer; ride the rapids, July 4th parade, Taos and Red River sightseeing and shopping, and other activities. Also, Ken and Jeanette would raffle off two bedrooms in their house for two couples to stay with them so they would not have any hotel room expense for their stay in Angel Fire.
